- Ensuring and assuring the highest quality of teaching and learning so that all pupils are explicitly and expertly taught powerful and core knowledge in and across all subjects.
- Giving them the important knowledge they need to understand, participate, question and interpret themselves and the world around them.
- Developing deep core knowledge for lifelong learning and enrichment within and beyond the curriculum.
- Ensuring and assuring that all pupils have 'a seat at the table' of society and are empowered with a confident voice for themselves and others through 'the best that has been thought and said.'
- Pupils embrace and celebrate their own and others diversity and cultures through 'windows, mirrors and sliding doors' promoting self-reflection, self-awareness and social awareness. Therefore, cultivating an aspirational ethos for pupils to be the best version of themselves both as an individual and a member of society.

CURRICULUM IMPLEMENTATION

Key Stage 3 (Years 7,8 and 9)

We maximise learning in all subjects through the planning and delivery of a broad, balanced, relevant and ambitious curriculum for all. The design and delivery of our curriculum ensures pupils to learn powerful and key knowledge as well as remembering and learning more.

Pupils with SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disability) are taught the full curriculum and receive additional support as is appropriate for their needs.
